Preanesthetic Blood Profile

A preanesthetic blood profile can reduce your pet's risk under anesthesia. The *basic profile* detects liver, kidney and diabetic problems, while the *comprehensive profile* detects a broader range of issues. *We recommend testing every animal prior to the use of anesthesia.* Other specialized blood tests are also available and are listed below.

Tooth Extractions *(Dental cleaning procedures only)*

Severe health problems can result from tooth infections. Often the only treatment for infected teeth is extracting them. If you allow it, the attending veterinarian will attempt to identify and pull those teeth that cannot otherwise be saved.

The cost of each tooth extraction is generally \$6.00 but may range up to \$40.00 depending on the difficulty of the procedure.

We strongly recommend allowing us to extract teeth that jeopardize your pet's health.

Dental X-Rays *(Dental cleaning procedures only)*

X-rays of your pet's mouth can identify problems that may otherwise go undiagnosed. Tooth decay and disease can often be addressed before they compromise your pet's health. X-rays can also increase the safety of extracting certain teeth.

Dental X-Rays cost \$18.00 for the first picture and \$9.00 for each additional picture required. Usually 4 to 6 x-rays are required to get a complete view of your pet's mouth. *We recommend dental x-rays for all animals with any gum problems or periodontal disease*
